Bob pointed out that this child is autistic & our brief exposure to him gave us a glimpse as to what some parents experience raising children with this disorder. Zoe and Alexandra are both 3rd year college students, leaning toward the nursing or physician assistant medical fields; they assisted with taking vitals & holding infants for mothers being examined.

Chris arranged cleaning of the building vacated by Valentine, and we enjoyed eating pizza there instead of crowding into the optical clinic for lunch.

Mark Rudolph landed at Mexicali & experienced voltage regulator failure, but fortunately a mechanic was available and replaced it with a borrowed one from another aircraft. Before Mark was in the air again, there was much discussion among the pilots as to how they could transport Mark's passengers to clinic & then return them home on Sunday, but those plans did not need to be activated.

We returned home with good weather the entire way, but Peter & Mark were not able to return to their home airports due to the fires.

Backpacks for Baja

October Clinic celebrated reaching nearly 2,700 "Backpacks For Baja" distributed to those in need since the program began in 2014!!!

Chris, with the assistance of several local volunteers, distributed over 90 backpacks to children attending the clinic. Each backpack includes sunglasses, important sundries such as tooth brushes and toothpaste as well as school supplies and a first aid kit. In addition each backpack includes a book donated by Celeste Roseberry-McKibbin of "Love Talk Read". Women attending the clinic also received handmade handbags that include personal care items, sunglasses, and a special gift.

Other volunteers also distributed many donated items and sundries such as toothpaste, soap, shampoo and lotions. In addition there were special handmade dresses that were made and/or acquired in support of the "Dress A Girl Around The World" initiative. This initiative is designed to provide at least one nice dress to as many young girls as possible to build Dignity, Health, Joy and

Love. Each dress was personally fitted to a happy recipient. **Barbara Harris** and **Linda Daniel** of the "**Inner Wheel Ladies**" with the help of **Ann Hively** donated a supply of special books

Optical Clinic

A RECORD!!!! 100% of the patients needing glasses were fitted on the spot!!!

Historically, we have been able to fit about 94% of the patients with glasses on the day of the clinic and we then order the remainder online for delivery by one of the pilots the following month. Thanks to the knowledge and patience of **Margie Wilson** and the assistance she received from **Peter Le Lievre** in the fitting/evaluation area 100% of the patients needing prescription glasses were fitted on the spot!!! This is a very significant improvement in our ability to assist those in need of vision care.

This was a team effort with **Joe Zachwieja** overseeing the work flow, interpreting and assisting with training, **Tom Ward**, a new volunteer, taking responsibility for the initial Auto Refractor exam and **Judy**, our local volunteer managing the intake of new patients and assisting with exams as well as providing knowledgeable assistance to all

We had a pre exam and initial patient intake forms completed by two local high school students Ynez, whose family owns

"Tiburon's Pongas" and Cinthia, whose family owns "The Old Mill Hotel". Ynez and Cinthia also handed out purses that they had made for young girls. Each purse was filled with meaningful items to brighten lives!!!

The total number of patients seen was well over 200 with 83 exams using the Auto Refractor. In addition we gave out 48 pairs of readers and 4 pairs of glasses ordered from months prior. We also distributed approximately 175 pairs of sunglasses not including those that were in the Backpacks given to women and children. The children's sunglasses were a big hit as many of the recipients had never had the opportunity to own a pair in the past and the styles were current and "cool" with themes that they could relate to such as Spiderman for the boys. The children's sunglasses as well as some of the readers distributed were provided by The Restoring Vision organization as well as The Lions Club...Thanks!!!

Dental Report

Every successful business or organization has pivotal/hallmark moments that are remembered where far greater success is recognized. For the Dental Corps of the Mother Lode Chapter, Flying Samaritans - this particular clinic has to be one of those moments. As the dental coordinator – I've been trying to do this for years.... today it happened: We offered PREVENTATIVE dentistry for the first time in our chapter's history.



Until the past year or so, we've suffered from a lack of equipment which was required for proper dentistry, especially preventive dentistry, from being offered. To date, we've only offered to fix problems that already occurred. A bit ago, we obtained the needed equipment and for the first time, dental hygienists were part of our clinic today - improving the health of our patients and trying to prevent problems rather than fix ones that already occurred.

Robin Berrin, DDS, Wende Bohlke, RDH, Lisa Seidl, RDH, Michael Kime, Jack Ignatowicz. Mark Rudolf, and I comprised the dental team in addition to our trusty resident translator, Minerva. It was Dr. Berrin's, Wende's, and Lisa's first time working the dental clinic today and we all hope they return often. Dr. Berrin and I took one room and took care of the extractions, fillings, and dental consultations. Lisa and Wende took the other room and

spent the day cleaning the teeth of patient after patient.

Due to family matters, I had to depart the clinic early on Saturday around 4:30p. By that time, the dental staff had cleaned and scaled 30 sets of teeth, extracted 35 teeth, 10 fillings, and 9 dental consultations/limited examination. I'm sure the clinic continued into the early evening and these numbers grew by a bit by the time the dental crew quit.

I sincerely hope this trend of having hygienists attend dental clinics becomes a regularity. It was truly a great feeling to know we not only fixed existing problems, but really helped prevent new ones for once.
